### **Executive Committee and Board Activities**

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##### **Oklahoma Chapter Conference**

On October 3-4, Gulf Coast Regional Board Representative Tracey Hilburn attended the Oklahoma Chapter Conference in Oklahoma City where she administered the Oath of Office.

On October 15-18, Executive Director Derek Poarch attended the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Conference in San Diego, CA, where he presented an APCO update to a meeting of its Communications and Technology Committee.

On October 25-28, East Coast Regional Board Representative Dave Saffel attended the Virginia Chapter Conference in Roanoke, VA where he administered the Oath of Office to incoming officers.

##### **AppComm Workshop**

On October 31, the Executive Committee attended a workshop in Seattle, WA hosted by APCO on "Roadmapping Interoperability for Public Safety Apps" in which representatives from APCO, the First Responder Network Authority (FirstNet), National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), and

Department of Homeland Security (DHS) facilitated sessions focused on a variety of issues related to public safety app interoperability, including data interoperability, app security and testing, and legal and policy requirements.

### **Emerging Technology Forum**

On November 1-2, the Executive Committee participated in the 2016 Emerging Technology Forum, November 1-2 in Seattle, WA, which attracted 200 attendees. The forum included a welcome from Seattle Police Chief Kathleen O'Toole, Chief, a keynote address by Washington State's William Andrew Leneweaver, Deputy State E911 Coordinator for Enterprise Systems and updates by FirstNet Vice Chair Jeff Johnson

### **Project 43**

On the afternoon of November 2, the Executive Committee also sat in on deliberations of the Working Group (WG) Chairs of Project 43 who met in Seattle, WA, to collectively review progress on their WG deliverables and discuss issues that intersect the WGs on cybersecurity, governance, operations, technical, training and workforce.

## **In the News**

In October, APCO was mentioned in 354 traditional media articles, and had 73 social media mentions. During the month, APCO had an advertising value equivalency (AVE) of \$760,042 and 82,166,733 in potential reach. In articles where either APCO or NENA was mentioned, NENA received 47 percent and APCO received 53 percent of the coverage.

**NOTE:** APCO's media service has modified its tracking terms:

- **Advertising Value Equivalency (AVE)** places a monetary value on media coverage.
- **Potential Reach** gives insight into the number of potential viewers that have been exposed to a brand, product, event or topic over a specified date range. It is useful to understand reach because it helps you identify the size of the potential audience, as opposed to limiting the analysis to the number of articles a brand has been mentioned in.

## **Government Affairs**

### **Comments Submitted to the FCC on State Opt-Out Process**

APCO filed comments on October 21 responding to the FCC's proposed procedures for administering the state opt-out process as provided under the Public Safety Spectrum Act. APCO explained why opt-out is a false choice that will likely negatively impact the NPSBN and agreed the Commission should adopt a closely circumscribed role to evaluating state opt-out applications. ### **Comments Submitted to the FCC on Public Safety Narrowband Service Rules**

APCO filed comments on October 26 responding to the FCC's proposed amendments to the service rules governing public safety narrowband operations in the 700 MHz bands. APCO expressed support for amending the trunking rules for vehicular repeater systems (VRS), suggested further action to ensure baseline functionality and interoperability on 700 MHz interoperability channels, and offered views on Motorola's Petition for Clarification regarding 700 MHz device requirements. ## NASNA 2016 Interim Meeting

Also on October 26, Jeff Cohen attended and presented at the National Association of State 9-1-1 Administrators (NASNA) 2016 Interim Meeting in Kansas City, MO. Jeff delivered an update of subjects related to APCO's recent activities, including fighting to reclassify public safety telecommunicators as "protective" occupations, Next Generation 9-1-1, Project 43: Broadband Implications for the PSAP, 9-1-1 location accuracy developments and CSRIC Working Group 1.

## Spectrum Management

### Computer Assisted Pre-coordination Resource and Database System (CAPRAD)

AFC in cooperation with National Regional Planning Council (NRPC) and with federal grant support has been planning a much-needed upgrade to the CAPRAD application module. CAPRAD is used by 700 and 800 regional planning committees (RPCs) to pre-coordinate and approve 700 and 800 MHz applications for public safety licensees. In 2004, CAPRAD incorporated a number of additional features including a licensing module that allowed applicants and their representatives to create license applications for NEW licenses within the CAPRAD database and submit those license applications directly to 700 MHz regional planning committees for review and pre-coordination.

Since the 700 MHz public safety band was new, NEW license applications were all that were initially required by applicants. With the 700 MHz being available nationwide only upon the completion of the Digital Television Transition in June of 2009 (DTV Transition), applicants in some parts of the US did not have complete access to the 700 MHz band prior to June 2009 so CAPRAD was in place for a significant amount of time before any licenses were created in the band in those areas. Generally speaking, this pushed the need for 700 MHz license modification out for some time in those areas and it has only been in the last few years where the need to modify 700 MHz applications has risen amongst existing 700 MHz licensees throughout the US.

The upgrade project will be completed by March 2017. The initial phase is well underway and is slated for completion by mid-November. More to follow on the subject in coming months.

### 700 MHz Regional Planning Committees Plans (valid as of 10/24/2016)

Until the regions have developed their plans and had those plans approved by the FCC, no licenses (other than state-wide licenses on the 2.4 MHz state allocation at 700 MHz) can be granted at 700 MHz. Fifty-four of the 55 regions have either held or set the date for their first meeting. Forty-six (46) regional plans have been approved (there are 55 regional planning committees), one is pending plan amendment, and eight have not submitted their plans.

FCC directed the 700 RPCs to file Plan amendments to address how the Regions would process applications for the 700 MHz narrowband "former reserve" frequencies. In Regions with T-Band cities, T-band incumbents must be given priority access to the former reserve frequencies for a period of at least five years. The regions were given until October 30, 2015 to file such amendments.



## Training and Certification

### Instructor, Supervisor, and CTO Continuing Education Opportunities

The APCO Institute is developing new offerings under the highly successful Illuminations series with special programs for instructors, communication center supervisors and CTOs. The APCO Institute recognizes the need for continuing education and is working to provide new ways to provide CDEs.

The instructor continuing education program will include topics, such as student engagement, deeper learning, Multiple Intelligences and lesson planning. For comm center supervisors, the topics will include time management, setting goals, and soft skills training on communication and active listening. Finally, the CTO series will look at generational learning, performance-based training, documentation and feedback, as well as remedial training.

The other new offerings are planned to launch in the first quarter of 2017.

### Institute Announces New Conference Course Pricing for Chapters

Based on the results of a Chapter Leaders Survey, the Institute is pleased to announce the following reduced price structure for hosting APCO courses before or after chapter conferences:

- **Specialty One-Day Courses, 8 Hours Each: \$99 per attendee** - 20 attendee minimum
- **Two Specialty Courses, One-Day Each, 8 Hours Each: \$79 per attendee** - 20 attendee per day minimum
- **Comprehensive Quality (2-day course): \$199 per attendee** - 20 attendee minimum
- **CTO (3-day course): \$249 per attendee** - 10 attendee minimum, 16 maximum
- **CCS (3-day course): \$249 per attendee** - 10 attendee minimum, 16 maximum

### Chapter Challenge

Texas and North Carolina APCO Chapters met the requirements for the Chapter Challenge and were awarded a Chapter Conference Course at a reduced rate in conjunction with their 2016 conferences. Courses conducted were "Disaster Operations and the Communications Center" and "Call Processing Incidents Involving Veterans with PTSD."

### Co-host/Contract Class Promotion

Due to the overwhelming success of a similar promotion earlier this year, the APCO Institute is once again offering free online course registrations to all agencies that host an Institute course. Agencies that schedule and host an APCO Institute course before June 30, 2017, will receive two free registrations for eight-hour online courses.

That's in addition to one free registration for the class they host. The offer applies to co-host and contract classes that are confirmed by May 31, 2017. However, it is not applicable for courses already scheduled prior to October 20, 2016.

## Comm Center and 9-1-1 Services

### Standards Development

Several new workgroups met during the month of October and the remainder are expected to meet during the next month. The three standards below have completed consensus balloting and are now awaiting final approval from ANSI.

- APCO ANS 3.1102.2-201x Core Competencies and Minimum Training Standards for Public Safety Communications Supervisor
- APCO ANS 3.102.2-201x Core Competencies and minimum Training Standards for Public Safety Communications Training Officer
- APCO ANS 3.106.2-201x Core Competencies and Minimum Training Standards for Public Safety Communications Quality Assurance Evaluators

Comments were received and a review group will be established on the following standard:

- APCO ANS 1.113.1-201x Public Safety Communications Incident Handling Process

#### **NFPA 1061: Professional Qualifications for Public Safety Telecommunications Personnel**

This document is open for second draft comments through 11/17/2016. The second draft meeting for technical committee members will take place in January, 2017.

#### **NFPA 1221: Standard for the Installation, Maintenance, and Use of Emergency Services Communications Systems**

APCO representatives on the 1221 Technical Committee participated remotely in the first draft meeting for the 2019 edition on October 19-21 in Phoenix, AZ. APCO reiterated positions regarding scope expansion into areas of NG 9-1-1, and call processing for law enforcement.

#### **Agency Training Program Certification Committee**

The on-line training for evaluators and agencies has been updated by the Agency Training Program Committee for the website.

For the 2017 Conference year;

- 1 agency received certification
- 2 agencies are in the review stage
- 28 agencies are in the application stage

#### **RETAINS Study Upgrade**

Plans are in the works in 2017 for a major upgrade of the RETAINS study and a corresponding update to the Effective Practice Guide. More details to follow.

#### **CTIA Test Bed LLC TAC**

This work group continues to meet weekly. APCO's request for test bed results with data broken down by morphologies, and between the test regions (San Francisco and Atlanta), received approval and will be accessible in the same format as it is to non-nationwide carriers.

#### **CTIA Location Accuracy PSAP Implementation Work Group**

The co-chairs (APCO, NENA, and Sprint) will hold these calls monthly. Recent developments in Class of Service descriptions, ANI ALI screen presentation, and the definition of dispatchable location using building type will assist this work group in developing training material for PSAPs.

#### **ATIS Emergency Services Interconnection Forum (ESIF)**

Staff attended the ESIF 59 face-to-face meetings of Alliance for Telecommunications Industry Solutions (ATIS) at the Cisco offices in Miami, Florida, on October 26 and 27. Emergency Services Methodologies, Next Generation Emergency Services, and IMS911 - IP Multimedia Subsystem for 911 subcommittee meetings were held.
